## S.M.A.R.T Energy Exchange (SEE) launches in Georgia, to Reduce Energy Usage the SMART Way

According to Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC): "There has been a veritable explosion in the number of electronics, appliances, and other miscellaneous devices plugged into, or permanently connected to, America's homes. Most are consuming electricity around-the-clock, even when the owners are not using them or think they have been turned off. This always-on energy use by inactive devices translates to \$19 billion a year -- about \$165 per U.S. household on average -- and approximately 50 large (500-megawatt) power plants' worth of electricity".

As consumers become increasingly more mobile, they are also more dependent on batteries. The amount of electric energy consumed to charge batteries has been left largely unchecked. In fact, it's been rapidly increasing. With no clear energy efficiency standards for charging systems, there has never been a real motivator for manufacturers to implement waste-reducing charging technology.

That's about to change.
